

Kadam Badhate Chalo 2.0 Launched in 3 Locations

The Kadam Badhate Chalo 2.0 program, in partnership with PRIA (Society for Participatory Research in Asia) and MFF (Martha Farrell Foundation), was launched in September 2017 in 3 new locations of Japla (Jharkhand) and Panna and Sehore (Madhya Pradesh).



In Japla, the program was launched in partnership with local partners Sahbhagi Shikshan Kendra, with a Gender through Sports workshop held for 91 youth (42 female; 49 male) from 15-16 September. This workshop provided the youth with a basic understanding of gender in everyday life, including prevalent stereotypes and socialization processes, via creative sports activities.



In Panna and Sehore, the program is being implemented in partnership with local partners Samarthan. In both locations, the program was launched with multiple Freedom to Play sports camps designed to provide youth, both females and males, a safe environment to participate in various sports activities together to learn about team building, leadership and equality, and nominate themselves to become a part of the program.



In Panna, the Freedom to Play camp was delivered in 5 locations to a total of 171 youth (80 females; 91 males) from 21-23 September. In Sehore it was delivered in 2 locations to a total of 92 youth (66 females; 26 males) from 25-26 September.

Training Workshop Conducted for PSD Coaches in BBSR
